Annual report 2011

Over the last 12 months your Parish Council has:

- Obtained funding from The Fylde LSP Parish/Town Fund to install CCTV monitoring 24/7 in the memorial Park. This is linked to the LCC constabulary CCTV network.
- Provided land for the Freckleton Cricket Club to establish all weather cricket nets.
- Listened to the villagers and dog owners with respect to the dog banning order on Bush lane playing fields such that the walk way around the sports field has now been clarified.
- Established a junior football pitch which has been approved by the FA. We have also obtained funding of £3000 from The Fylde LSP Parish/Town Fund, to improve the drainage of the football pitch.
- Have actively supported Frank Towers, Chairman of the Rawstorne Sports
 Committee, in his bid to raise funds to establish a Sports hall in accordance with
 the Freckleton Parish Plan 2005. (See www.frecklestorneproject.org.uk)
- LCC have finally updated the crossing lights at the Kirkham/Lytham Road/School Lane Junction. This was an action resulting from the Freckleton Parish Plan, and follows pressure from the C.E School, as part of their school Travel Plan.

United Utilities are due to start work on their drainage scheme at The Bush lane allotments in May. In the meantime, preparatory work is going on. Rest assured that the Parish Council will be monitoring this work, and taking appropriate action to minimize disturbance to local residents along Green lane, Naze Lane East and Preston Old Road.

With the Localism Bill being introduced by the Coalition Government, the Parish Council will be facing new challenges over the next twelve months.

Finally my thanks are due to:-

- Ken and Julie for all their hard work, and Clir Mrs. S. Delany and Clir Mrs. M. Whitehead for their help and support over the last 12 months.
- Of course we must not forget Cltr.Tommy Threfall and the Freckleton in Bloom committee, John Garlick and Andy, who achieved a prize beyond their highest hopes last year. I hope the village will rally around the Freckleton in Bloom Committee members and give them all the help they need this year.
- PC Andy Scarisbrick also deserves a word of thanks for his conscientious work in the Parish.
- Bill, my lip speaker, without who I could not have coped and finally the Parish Council as a whole for putting up with me.

Chairman of Finance's report 2011

1. Precept account (including Open Spaces).

•The Councils expenditure for 2010/11 was within the budget of £96,797.

2. Community development Account

• The interest on the savings, in this account, has been reduced considerably due to the reduction in interest rates as a result of the recession. Despite the capital expenditure listed below this account has only been reduced by £3,292.

3. Playground fund

• The monies received from the bank of America shares has reduced considerably.

As a result there was a shortfall in this account of £1,975. In future this expenditure will be met from the Precept account.

4. Capital expenditure for 2010/11

The following capital expenditure has been completed in 2010/11

- Donation to Rural Splash (for the running of Kirkhain Baths) £2k
- A donation to the Village Hall Memorial trust, to help build up a maintenance reserve account. - £1k
- The purchase of a Roller, Spikes and chains, for the maintenance of the foothall pitch £700.
- New goalposts for a junior football pitch on the Bush lane sports field £817
- Cavity wall and roof insulation for the Guide and Scout buildings £2,323
- Heaters for the Guide and band buildings £3k
- The purchase of a new permanent CCTV camera in the Memorial park £8k (a donation of £5k was received from the Local Strategic Partnership Parish Fund).
- New lights for Christmas tree and Cenotaph area- £325
- The use of a lipspeaker, whilst Councillor Robb was chairing the meetings £1303. Councillor Robb's contribution for this service was £1,000.

5. Proposed Capital Expenditure for 2011/12

Two new tennis nets, including trolleys	£1.5k
Assistance with the new supports around the bowling green	£2k
• Improved drainage on the Junior Football pitch	£5k

A cry for help from the Freckleton In Bloom-ers

For those of you who don't already know Freckleton won the North West in Bloom Gold Award for 2010, being judged the best town in the north west of England. Quite an achievement! As a result Freckleton is now nominated to enter the 2011 National RHS Britain in Bloom competition.

To help increase our chances of success we need the resident's help, your help, to make the village look as beautiful as we can. We need help with weeding and dead heading of the flower beds, assistance in the "big clean up" evenings prior to judging, which mainly involves the clearance of litter. The exact date for these will be posted around the village in June.

Judging for this year's North West competition will be in July and judging for the national competition will be in August.

We would ask those of you who live along the judging route to assist us by ensuring your own gardens are in tip top condition as this will impact on the judges scoring. The details of that route are set out below.


Freckleton in Bloom - Judging Route 2011 (subject to time)

Councillor Threlfall and the Freckleton in Bloom volunteers will meet the judges at the village hall for a 15 minute presentation of the 2011 In Bloom initiatives. Two Freckleton in Bloom members will then accompany the judges on a tour around the village.

On leaving the hall they will view the C of E school wildlife garden before travelling to Strike Lane school. They will then travel back through the village to the Rawstrone Centre to look at the recycling and sports facilities, of which Freckleton prides itself. On route they will pause to view/walk around Balderstone and the Trophy Wall. Following the Rawstrone Centre there will be a stop to view the horticultural allotments on Croft Butts Lane where there will be a walkabout to see the standards of the allotments and to talk to allotment holders. They will then travel by car to view Bunker Street, Dibbs Pocket and Lower Lane before turning right onto the bypass so that they can view the full route back into the village including the 'Welcome to Freckleton' stone.

After parking in the village centre they will continue on foot to the recycling areas, Memorial gardens, bowling green and on through the park. Returning back from the park, they will view the village centre and war memorial (winner of Lancashire's Best War Memorial in 2010) and there will be the opportunity for photographs. Time permitting there will be a walk (or a drive) up to the roundabout to view examples of sustainable planting, decorations and features including the new feature bed.

Finally they will travel back along Lytham Road to Lamaleach Caravan Park where the tour will end.
