T Threlfall. - Any news on the loose kerb stones around the village that I brought up at a previous meeting. P Rigby - I will bring it up again.

L Rigby - Wyndene Grove has large pot holes. I have reported them.

The railings by the Spar shop. - P Rigby has reported they look a mess and is trying to have them replaced.

Cllr St J Greenhough reported Lytham Rd. pot holes are getting very deep.

A request has been raised by letter from a member of the public requesting it be cut twice a week. The clerk pointed out that this would be subject to an annual increase in cost of £2500.

Cllr P Holt reported that since she has taken over as treasure the money has gone down. We don't have a secretary the current social secretary is a volunteer and she has not received any money from her since December.

The chairman stated that a fundamental problem was there was no football section over the winter. The summer has the cricket section.

Cllr N Griffiths asked if it has to be a Freckleton team play on the pitch. Chairman – it has to be local teams.

The Chairman asked how we move forward on this, as the obligation is on the council to come up with a solution as the people of the village expect the centre to be available to them.

Cllr L Rigby suggested the Council should meet with the Rawstorne centre committee.

The Chairman commented that it is imperative we get a secretary. Also Football activity during the winter. The Clerk suggested they look at the model of how the bowling club is run on as it is very good example.
