## The Annual Parish Assembly Meeting 3rd April, 2023

The Annual Parish Assembly took place on the 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2023 in The Village Hall where 9 Councillors were present and 2 gave apologies. The purpose of this meeting is to summarise the year's activities and to invite the public to hear these reports from the Chairman and Chairman of Finance, or any organisation that the Council give significant funding to, along with Financial Statements for the year. The public are provided with an opportunity for participation to express opinions on what the Council are doing. Unfortunately, there were no members of the public present.

## **Chairman's Annual Report 2023**

Congratulations to the Village for winning the gold medal in the North West In-Bloom competition last year. Many thanks to the In Bloom committee, all the Contractors and Volunteers that made our Village so colourful. I extend a special thanks to Lorenzos for the buffet they provided us one evening.

I would like to thank the Parish Council for its support in agreeing to organise an event for the King's Coronation in the Memorial Park & Coach & Horses car park on 07/05/23.

A Blue Plaque is to be installed to mark the first Police house in the Village, on Kirkham Road. Other sites are being considered.

Dog fouling throughout the Village continues to be a major concern to residents. Fylde Borough Council are being encouraged to improve enforcement. To minimise this issue, I also extend my thanks to the residents who have helped in this matter

The celebrations on Christmas Eve, including the Fireworks displayed was enjoyed by many of the villagers. My thanks go to Peter Walton, for organising the display and to Carol Thomas for arranging the event.

## **Club Day & Half Marathon**

The Annual Club Day Parade and Sports events will be held on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> June and the Half Marathon will run on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> June. **Please note the start time change to 10.30am.** 

## Half Marathon - Interesting facts.

This year sees the 59th Male Half Marathon, it was first run on Saturday evening 19th June 1965. The event was the idea of the then Chairman of the Sports Committee, Councillor Dick Rhodes who was inspired by Ron Hill's entry in the Marathon in the 1964 Tokyo Olympics; he suggested to the then Sports Secretary for the Half Marathon Mr. Dennis Vickers, write to invite Ron to run in our first race which he did. By today's standards, the entry was a modest 53 entrants, mainly from local athletic clubs in Lancashire, but some from further afield. The race was a success and was won by Ron Hill in a time of 65.44. Four years later Ron Hill set the course record of 64.45, which stands to this day.

Ron ran in the Freckleton Half Marathon four times in total 1965,1969,1970 &1971, representing for Clayton-le -moors Harriers at Freckleton but represented Great Britain serval times in the European Championship, when he won a gold medal in 1969, and England in the Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh where he won a gold medal in 1970. Dr. Ron Hill MBE sadly passed away on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2021.

In 1977 the women ran for the first time. In 1988, Veronique Marot ran at Freckleton and she holds the female course record of 72.56, Veronique ran in several marathons in her career and also represented Great Britain in 1992 Barcelona Olympics.

Over the years there have been several multiple winners of the men's race such as Ken Moss, Pete Banks, Paul Muller, Ben Fish to name a few, and we have even had winners from as far away as Canada.

The Half Marathon race continued to take place in the evening during the adult sports until 1982. By then the entry had expanded to several hundred and the decision to switch it to the Sunday afternoon in 1983; This year's race is again switching to Sunday morning at the runner's request.

### **Freckleton Library**

Liaison meetings with the Local Parish Councils have recommenced earlier to keep the local community aware of developments at the Company, with specific relevance to our locality. Work continues on Typhoon development and production and the Company is hopeful of further production work on this project. The company is expanding its work force, after a period of reduction, with commencement of work on the Tempest Future Combat System. They are expecting

some 1000 persons per year for the next five years, many of which will be local to Warton or Samlesbury.

However, the changes in working practices introduced during the COVID 19 emergency are largely remaining in place, reducing the footfall on site overall. The busiest days centre around midweek, when up to 60% may be working on site, excepting for those engaged on various test facilities or aircraft assembly, maintenance or flight trials.
