We all have a responsibility to help the Police prosecute the very tiny minority of irresponsible dog owner, who habitually act in this anti social way. Please let us know if you witness any dog fouling. I give the assurance that prosecutions will follow.

For the first time in many years, we have had no Youth club, following the condemnation of the old cricket pavilion, because of health and safety problems. I am pleased to announce that the Parish Council and the Village hall committee have agreed that, in the short term, the Village hall, in School lane, can be used for this purpose. Details of when the Youth Club will be opened are shown on poster around the Village and on the Council's web site. In the long term, it remains a priority of the Council to seek funds to build a new, custom designed, Youth club in the centre of the village.

Parish Plan.

Since the last Newsletter, Councillor Colin Robb and Simon, one of the volunteers, have attended a seminar in October presented by Community Futures, regarding the setting up of the Freckleton Village Development Trust. The seminar also included information about sources of external funding.

Arising from this, a discussion with Community Futures was held with, the full Council present on the 11th January. The next step is to discuss and agree with the various Parish organisations the type of trust we will set up and its membership.

In November at an extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council the action list from the Parish Plan was prioritised, see Parish Council meeting report dated 21st November 2005, available in the library or on the Parish Council website.

The most immediate action arising from this meeting will be the establishment of the Community Notice board sometime early in the financial year 2006/2007. Further details about this will be available in the next Newsletter.

As an urgent priority, actions are ongoing to locate a home for the youth club/younger years. Initially, this will be in the Village hall until such times as a permanent new building can be built.

New Youth Club.

Equitable Taxation

In recent months, there has been a lot of press coverage over Fylde Borough Council's budget deficit and their proposals on Equitable taxation.

Equitable taxation will involve the Parish Councils taking over responsibility for the financial control of the facilities that Fylde Borough Council currently finances in the Parishes.

These are exciting times for the Parish, as these proposals would lead to expenditure being devolved back to us. The Parish Council are of the view that we can spend your money more efficiently than Fylde Borough Council do and in areas where we know it is required.

The initial proposals will involve the "Open Spaces" budget (maintaining public parks, grass verges and public buildings). The Parish Council already receives an annual grant set by FBC and we undertake this workload on their behalf. If these proposals go ahead, we will be able to set our own budget for this workload.

This will mean that, in future, the people of Freckleton will only pay for the Open Spaces facilities provided by the Parish Council and will not have to contribute for the facilities that are available in the rest of the Borough.

If these proposals go ahead, it is envisaged that, in future, other facilities may be devolved to the Parish Council and we are confident that we will be able to provide them more efficiently than FBC currently do. We will keep you informed, via this Newsletter and the web site, as this issue progresses.
