Freckleton in Bloom

Once again, our thanks go to the Freckleton in Bloom committee for the fine display of bedding plants and hanging baskets that are on display around the village. The Council appreciates all the hard work that goes into the preparation and planting to make the village so colourful.

Harry Robinson

The Parish Council would like to pass on their congratulations to Harry for being awarded the MBE in the recent Queen's birthday honours list. Harry currently serves on a number of committees within the village and his work is much appreciated by all. He was a member of the Parish Council for many years prior to his retirement in 1999. His involvement in other voluntary work is too numerous to mention individually, but he has served the Community well in all aspects of live.

Grass verges - Balderstone road.

The Council has concluded that the two grass verges at the top end of Balderstone road have been designated as play areas and as such, children are permitted to play in these areas. To try to resolve the problem of damage caused by wayward balls, it has been agreed that shrubs and trees should be restored along the boundary with Lodge Close, as and when finances are available. The Open Spaces committee will now prepare costings for this project and plan when this work can be carried out.

Memorial park

The Council has recently installed railings around the play equipment in the Memorial park. This is to make it safer for young children to use the play equipment, without wandering and to ensure dogs and other animals are kept out. The Council would like to remind everyone that the equipment is only for use by children up to the age of 12 years old.

It has been brought to the Council's attention that golf balls are being hit in the park. This is both dangerous to others (one person has already been hit on the head) and can cause damage to the neighbouring properties. A national byelaw prohibits golf balls being hit in public places. The Council asks that individuals use the nearby golf range.
