<u>Parish Plan.</u>

You should all have received your copy of the Freckleton Parish Plan at the end of July. If you did not, please contact the Parish Clerk or Cllr. Colin Robb for a copy. The Plan was handed over to, and formally accepted by, the Parish Council at a short ceremony on the 8th July.

Actions are currently in place to establish the Freckleton Village Design Trust. At a meeting on the 10th October, the basic remits were agreed. It is, however, a complicated process, every detail must be correct in order to ensure that the Trust is eligible for grants and funding. The Trust will be totally independent of the Freckleton Parish Council and will only deal with those aspects of the Parish Plan which are of a charitable nature. More information on this should be available by Christmas.

The other actions of the Parish Plan will, in the main, be progressed by the Parish Council, although some may be delegated.

LCC Youth and Community have contacted the Council regarding Youth facilities. This is currently on going.

Over the next few months, work will start on the other actions of the Parish Plan.

Dog Fouling

Once again, it has become necessary to remind people to clean up after their dogs in public places. The Memorial park and Bush lane playing fields are areas of concern and the Council is determined to take the appropriate action to ensure these areas are kept clean. Even if it means taking legal action against the offenders.

Additional litter bins are to be installed in Goa lane, Bush lane playing field and the lane by the boat yard on Preston Old road.

Please help to keep the village tidy by cleaning up after your dog and using the appropriate bins.

Lancashire best kept village Competition.

The Parish has been awarded three winners prizes in this year's competition:-

- 1. Most improved large Village.
- 2. Public Playing Fields for the Memorial park
- 3. Special features for the Roundabout on Preston New road.

Hitting golf balls in Public Areas

Once again, it has been brought to the Council's attention that golf balls are being hit on the Bush lane playing Fields. This is both dangerous to others and can cause damage to the neighbouring properties. A National byelaw prohibits golf balls being hit in public places. The Council is determined to take the appropriate action to ensure this type of activity stops, even if it means taking legal action against the offenders The Council asks that individuals use the nearby golf range.
