We are of course sorry to report that the Library in Freckleton is now closed. However your petitions were presented to our local MP Mark Menzies who in turn presented them to the Secretary of State for Media Culture & Sport. Subsequent to this we are informed that these representations are being treated as a formal complaint and Lancashire County Council are being contacted to explain their consultation process and the Secretary of State will then look into the matter to see if the Council Library Service remains "Comprehensively Efficient".

With regard to the missing American Collection the Lancashire County Council has sourced 52 of the books they destroyed and together with the ones that remained a place to keep them is currently being sought.
